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Recommendations for communication challenges during COVID

Wearing face masks in public has become necessary in order to help limit the spread of coronavirus, but that's not the only thing the masks limit. While important from a health perspective, it is also important to understand the unintended consequences of face coverings for our patients. Patients report increased difficulty communicating due to masks reducing volume and clarity of speech as well as eliminating visual cues needed for lip reading. Unfortunately, that's not the only problem people with hearing loss and hearing aids are encountering.

What is a hearing aid wearer to do?

Here are some tips to make face mask and hearing aid wearing more comfortable:

- Use a mask with soft fabric ties that can go all the way around your head to avoid wearing elastic loops behind on your ears
- Use a mask holder/extender that is worn near the back of the head and can hold the mask ear loops to help reduce interference with your hearing aids (many medical practitioners now use these, since they have to wear tight-fitting masks all day)
- Attach a button onto your eyeglasses using small rubber bands or by sewing them around the arm of the glasses to avoid placing the elastic around your ears
- Be extra careful not to rush when removing the mask so you do not yank the hearing aids out of your ear and potentially lose them
- Check that the hearing aids are still in place after you remove your mask

New appointment options available

During this challenging time, we have several options to address patient needs while ensuring health and safety. We are pleased to announce that we are now able to offer remote programming for our patients wearing select hearing aids that have this technology available. Remote programming allows adjustments to be made to the hearing devices without the patient having to come to the office. While we still offer in person appointments, remote programming provides an opportunity for patients to receive some services or adjustments from the comfort of their home. We are also able to provide curbside appointments when appropriate at several office locations.

At Whisper Hearing Centers, we care about the health and safety of our patients. Following CDC guidance, we have implemented COVID screenings, enhanced cleaning procedures, and use personal proper protective equipment. We understand how challenging it can be for people with hearing loss during a pandemic and are trying to do everything possible to make our patients' lives easier.
